Every year in Australia, more than 48,000 babies are born requiring specialised care due to prematurity or sickness at birth. Sadly, up to 1,000 babies will lose

their fight for life.

Parents are at increased risk of post natal depression, anxiety and PTSD, while babies can face heightened risk of disabilities, developmental delays, behavioural challenges and ongoing health conditions.

The impacts can last a lifetime.

About our core services:

- **NurtureLine:** Miracle Babies Foundation *NurtureLine* is a free family support helpline catering for families with a high-risk pregnancy, the hospital journey with a baby currently in NICU or SCN, the transition to home and onwards. Providing emotional, peer support to improve coping, mental health and access to information to empower these families throughout their journey, to advocate for their vulnerable newborn or child and for themselves.
- **NurtureTime:** Our qualified *Nurture*Time team members visit the hospital to offer support and guidance. Parents, family and friends can ask questions, share their thoughts and feelings knowing the Support Worker has a shared experience. Each *Nurture*Time service can cost upwards of \$25,000.
- **NurtureGroup:** free play and support group for families who have experienced the birth of a premature or sick newborn. The group allows families to connect with others who may face a similar journey and ongoing challenges and access ongoing support from Miracle Babies Foundation. We welcome all NICU and Special Care Nursery families. Each *Nurture*Group can cost upwards of \$15,000.

Along with resources provided throughout their time in hospital and an online information hub, improving education and empowering families and supporting positive health and mental health outcomes from pregnancy until their child reaches adulthood.



Miracle Babies Foundation is incredibly grateful for the support to provide vital resources to families in the NICU or Special Care Nursery.

These resources empower parents with information and tools to help them cope, build confidence, resilience and support their mental wellbeing during this overwhelming and traumatic time. Includes resources for admission to a NICU/Special Care Nursery (NICU Survival Pack), support for the transition from hospital to home (Grad Bag), support and information for providing breast milk in the NICU (Milk Express Pack), support for bereaved families (Memory Boxes) and Emergency Care Packs for unexpected admission.
