Welcome

A warm hearted welcome to *Nurture*Group! We hope that you find this guide to *Nurture*Group informative and that both you and your child enjoy your time here with us..

Nurture Group Overview

*Nurture*Group is a free play and support group for families and carers who have experienced the birth of a premature or sick newborn.

NurtureGroup enables babies and children (up to starting school) that have been challenged by prematurity or sickness to learn and develop through play in a fun and relaxed environment.

The sessions offer families ongoing parent support after leaving the safety of a NICU/SCN and an opportunity to share stories, exchange ideas on parenting, tackle ongoing medical and developmental issues, build support networks, form friendships and ease the isolation often felt by families of premature and sick newborns.

NurtureGroups are geared specifically towards the children's ongoing developmental needs and are equipped with toys and activities recommended by therapists to help advance physical development.

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Nurture Group offers children

- a healthy, safe and secure environment
- regular time away from home
- an ideal place to learn and develop through play
- help develop social skills in a group situation with a parent or caregiver for support
- create a family setting with parents, babies, toddlers and preschool aged children playing together
- provide a large range of toys and play experiences geared specifically towards their ongoing development, often not available at home
- time with qualified health professionals to assess and engage their development and need for specialised therapy or services.

NurtureGroup offers parents

- regular time with our Miracle Babies NurtureProgram Team
- social interaction and adult conversation
- ease the feeling of isolation, anxiety and depression
- time to share experiences, interests and ideas
- time with qualified health professionals to gain information, assistance, and advice on their child's development



What happens at **Nurture**Group?

NurtureGroup sessions usually meet fortnightly for 2 hours.

At your first session your *Nurture*Group Coordinator will give you a tour, explain routines and introduce you to other families and our team.

You should generally have completed a Registration Form online.

An Attendance Register is kept for all present at each session including children, parents and volunteers. We kindly ask that you remember to sign the register upon your arrival and departure.

Each *Nurture*Group runs slightly different depending on the families in attendance and the children's ages. As a general guide, each session includes time for; setting up, free play, morning tea (supplied for all in attendance), activity, general clean up and pack away.

During the sessions, parents, carers and children participate in a variety of play activities and experiences which may include: outdoor and free play, music and singing, imaginative play, arts and craft activities.

You are welcome to contribute any suggestions to assist with the future planning of *Nurture*Group sessions and to develop skills to help run the *Nurture*Group.

Parents and caregivers are required to stay for the session to interact with the other adults and to play with the children. *Nurture*Group is not a child minding event.



Frequently Asked Questions

Who can attend a NurtureGroup?

NurtureGroup welcomes children from birth to starting school who were cared for in a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit or Special Care Nursery, either through prematurity or complications as a result of their birth or congenital abnormalities. Parents or carers of these children and siblings are all welcome to attend.

Who will be involved in facilitating NurtureGroup?

Each *Nurture*Group is facilitated by a minimum of one approved Miracle Babies Foundation *Nurture*Program team member (staff or volunteer).

Health Professional Involvement

It is important to note that *Nurture*Group is NOT a specialist therapeutic provider; however health professionals may attend *Nurture*Group intermittently to provide information, assistance and expert advice of the children's development. These health professionals may include a Social Worker, Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist, Speech Pathologist, Dietitian, Nurse and other disciplines as arranged.

Can siblings attend *Nurture*Group?

Siblings are welcome at *Nurture*Group and provides them with an important opportunity to play with their sibling.

Will families need to pay for NurtureGroup?

Funding from Miracle Babies Foundation enables families to attend *Nurture*Group at no cost.



Wellness Policy

Due to the ongoing health concerns of children challenged by prematurity or sickness we do not allow attendance of children or parents/carers, who are unwell, have a temperature, sickness, diarrhoea, or who have an infectious disease.

In addition we ask that children or parents do not attend where there is a case of sickness or diarrhoea in another member of the family.

Infectious diseases can spread quickly among young children. It is therefore very important that parents notify the *Nurture*Program team member for that service immediately if their child is suspected of having an infectious disease. Parents/carers will be informed if there has been a notified case of an infectious disease at *Nurture*Group. Any child/parent/carer unwell within 48 hours of attending *Nurture*Program services should not attend or must provide a medical clearance from a qualified medical Doctor before attending.

Symptoms which will exclude a child, parent/carer from attending *Nurture*Program services:

- A common cold, with listlessness, green runny nose, watery eyes, persistent cough or sore throat, loss of voice should not attend until symptoms have fully ceased.
- Sore throat or trouble swallowing should not attend until symptoms have ceased or the child is diagnosed as not contagious.
- Difficulty breathing, wheezing or a persistent cough should not attend until symptoms have fully ceased or the child is diagnosed as not contagious.



- Nausea and vomiting may be early signs of illness should not attend until symptoms have fully ceased for 48 hours.
- Children with known or suspected communicable diseases eg. chicken pox, mumps, etc should not attend until the incubation period recommended by their doctor has passed.
- Infected skin or eyes, or an un-diagnosed rash (including conjunctivitis) should not attend until the prescribed treatment is completed or the incubation period recommended by the doctor has passed.
- Unexplained diarrhoea or loose stool which may indicate a bacterial or viral gastrointestinal infection, which is very easily passed from one child to another – should not attend until symptoms have fully ceased for 48 hours.
- Pain any complaint of unexplained or undiagnosed pain (not including complaints such as teething) – should not attend until symptoms have ceased or the child is diagnosed as not contagious.

A Clearance letter may be required for any of the above.





Safety and Security

Each parent and caregiver attending a *Nurture*Group must be responsible for the welfare and safety of the child/ren they bring.

There is also a collective responsibility of the whole group to ensure everyone has a safe environment in which to play. Keeping this in mind, remember that *Nurture*Groups need to keep a balance between being safe and allowing the children to take the risks necessary to develop new skills.

Our *Nurture*Program team members are to never be alone with a child or provide personal care to a child such as; feeding, toileting including nappy changes, administering medication, applying sunscreen.

NurtureGroups are a SMOKE-FREE zone because of the proven danger of passive smoking to small children and toxicity of cigarette butts.

Food and Drink

Snack and meal times are an important part of *Nurture*Group and we aim to provide nutritious food. As some children can have serious allergic reactions to nuts we request that *Nurture*Group remain a nut-free zone and no nuts or nut products are allowed.

However, while it is in the best interest for *Nurture*Group to be nut free, due to the shared use of our venues, this can not be guaranteed. It is the responsibility of the parent/carers to ensure the safety of their child.



Hot drinks are a burn hazard around children so it is mandatory that all hot drinks consumed at *Nurture*Group MUST have lids. Travel mugs with screw on lids are helpful, you are more than welcome to bring one along.

Confidentiality

NurtureGroup registration forms contain the names, addresses and telephone numbers of attendees and emergency contacts in case of a child's illness or accident as well as allergies, dietary requirements and illnesses of individual children.

Any such information will be regarded as completely confidential and will not be given to a third party for any reason. Such records will be kept by the *Nurture*Group Coordinator and will be available should they be required during a session.

Confidentiality also extends to the families attending *Nurture*Group and all attending should refrain from sharing confidential information divulged at *Nurture*Group without consent.

Confidentiality helps provide a safe place for families to share any challenges or difficulties with their premature or sick baby/child.

Grievance Policy

A parent with concerns about any aspect of *Nurture*Group should in the first instance raise this issue with the *Nurture*Group Coordinator.

An appointment can be made to discuss the matter and what action/suggestions they would like to see happen. Every effort will be made to resolve any matters within the setting of the *Nurture*Group.



Should the matter not be resolved at this level a parent/carer may communicate their concerns or complaint in writing to the CEO of Miracle Babies Foundation. If the matter raises concerns about a policy or practice a review will be undertaken.

Nurture Group - Code of Ethics

- Create a safe and respectful environment and community. Any bullying, slander or defamatory behaviours will not be tolerated.
- Be impartial, non-judgemental and non-discriminatory towards all board members, staff, volunteers and Miracle Babies
 Foundation service users; this includes discrimination based on race, sex, age, ethnic origin, religion, disabilities or sexual orientation.
- Adhere to the Wellness Policy, safety and security, food and drink rules in attending services or events.
- A copy of the Code of Ethics is emailed at registration and can be viewed on our website.

Establishing a safe & respectful Nurture Group

Be kind and courteous – we are all in this together to create a welcoming environment. Let's treat everyone with respect. Healthy debates are natural, but kindness is required.

No hate speech or bullying – make sure everyone feels safe. Bullying of any kind is not allowed, and degrading comments about things like race, religion, culture, sexual orientation, gender or identity will not be tolerated.

Respect everyone's privacy – being part of this Group requires mutual trust. Authentic, expressive discussions make groups great, but also may be sensitive and private. What's shared in a group should stay in the group.



Evaluation

Miracle Babies Foundation may request feedback of our services through evaluation forms, surveys and feedback forms from time to time.

We appreciate your cooperation in completing these forms, as this feedback goes towards improving and expanding our services and sourcing funding and supporters to continue this vital service for families.

Every year in Australia around 48,000 newborn babies require the help of a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) or Special Care Nursery (SCN). 27,000 of these babies are born premature and up to 1,000 babies lose their fight for life.
