Scope:	NurtureTime can be held in a group setting close to the NICU or individual support cot side. The NurtureTime Volunteer will facilitate these sessions for our continued commitment to provide the highest standard of care for families of premature and sick newborns.
Qualifications and Experience required:	Volunteers MUST have had a baby who has been an inpatient in a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) or Special Care Nursery (SCN).
Role and Responsibilities:	 Able to commit to a scheduled roster for a minimum period of 12 months within NurtureTime structured sessions Knowledge of organisation's programs, operations and services Welcome all parents who choose to participate in NurtureTime Support families as per NurtureTime and Hospital policies, procedures and guidelines Always remain professional and supportive Inform parents of your role and boundaries - in which you cannot offer medical advice but that you are solely there to provide peerto-peer support Provide information about ongoing support available from Miracle Babies Foundation or external services current in Australia
